941-1: Mediation Clinic (3cr) Wheeler	The professor will contact students prior to the first week of class to schedule two class meetings. The professor will attempt to schedule the two classes at a time convenient to all parties. The first-class meeting, which will be held at the law school, will involve a review of the course syllabus along with other course forms and a skills review using mock mediations. This first meeting is usually 3-4 hours in length. The second-class meeting of about two hours will be held at the Franklin County Municipal Court so students can meet the staff of the small claims court and the prosecutor's office as well as the magistrates of the small claims court. Most of the remainder of "class time" will be spent conducting and/or observing mediations in the small claims court in the afternoons from about 1:15 PM to 4:00 PM on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and/or Thursdays. Limited mediation opportunities are available in the prosecutor's office starting at either 5:00 PM or 6:00 PM on select evenings. Students may also have opportunities to observe mediations at other locations such as the Ohio Civil Rights Commission and the Franklin County Domestic Relations Court Mediation Program. One-hour Zoom classes will be held throughout the semester at times convenient to students and professor. Questions should be directed to Professor Terry Wheeler.
